Outline of the project idea	In the project we will_develop a new concept for training of teachers according to the challenges mentioned below.
	The challenge: Retention of students in education is a problem in upper secondary education and a major problem in vocational training, and it is a huge challenge to motivate the students for school. Innovation in teaching, learning processes and ICT seem to be a way to go. Innovation in teaching and learning processes can result in creating a new and more motivating school. We also want to include ICT as we notice that the students have mobile phones and lots of them are smartphones with smart technologies. Students have a natural way of implementing the cellphones in informal ways of learning, eg using Facebook to talk about tasks and to show what they are
	working with. It seems to be crucial that new teaching and learning processes are participatory and involve the students in many ways – according to a natural motivation for learning.
	The need: Innovation of new teaching and learning processes requires skills, and there is a major need for educating teachers in handling this challenge. This includes ICT, web 2.0, didactic design and innovation processes. This also includes a change of habits and attitudes in teaching.
	Our experience: We have experience within training of teachers and it is our experience that the teachers have problems adapting what they have learned at courses into their daily work. One of the findings is that we need to educate teachers in practice. One side of this is that it is meaningful to the teachers to work with their daily challenges according to their classes. This gives the teachers a natural confidence and courage to implement new ways of teaching in practice — and this is a more sure way to get the new methods - including smart technologies and web 2.0 technologies - implemented. Another side of educating teachers in practice is changing habits and attitudes in teaching and to get a diffusion of this and knowledge sharing of new achieved skills in the organization. That gives a mutual engagement, a joint project and a common repertoire, and this is seen as a strong alliance and a very good possibility to consolidate new habits, attitudes and skills. If we gather teachers from different organizations teachers must after the courses struggle for changes alone in the organization and the change of habits and attitude has a much more week position and
